The group clad in bright orange vests and armed with trash grippers, collected approximately 30 bags of trash.

The Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians who established the Community Network have partnered with Capital Valley Realty in ongoing clean up of the four-mile strip that borders Miwok land.

"Stewardship of the land has always been an important part of the Miwok tradition and deepening our ties to the community is a specific goal of the Shingle Springs Rancheria Community Network," says Stephanie Cuellar, Tribal Council Representative.
